## A BILL ENTITLED

1 AN ACT concerning

## Public Safety – Police Accountability – Time Limit for Filing Administrative Charges

- FOR the purpose of requiring a law enforcement agency to file any administrative charges
  arising out of an investigation of alleged police officer misconduct that is not required
  to be reviewed by an administrative charging committee within a certain period of
  time after the incident that led to the investigation; and generally relating to police
  accountability.

SECTION 1. BE IT ENACTED BY THE GENERAL ASSEMBLY OF MARYLAND,
 That the Laws of Maryland read as follows:

- 16 Article Public Safety
- 17 3–113.

(a) The investigating unit of a law enforcement agency shall immediately review
 a complaint by a member of the public alleging police officer misconduct.

20 (b) An administrative charging committee shall review and make a determination 21 or ask for further review within 30 days after completion of the investigating unit's review.

(c) The process of review by the investigating unit through disposition by the administrative charging committee shall be completed within 1 year and 1 day after the filing of a complaint by a citizen.

1 (D) A LAW ENFORCEMENT AGENCY SHALL FILE ANY ADMINISTRATIVE 2 CHARGES ARISING OUT OF AN INVESTIGATION OF ALLEGED POLICE OFFICER 3 MISCONDUCT THAT IS NOT REQUIRED TO BE REVIEWED BY AN ADMINISTRATIVE 4 CHARGING COMMITTEE WITHIN 1 YEAR AND 1 DAY FROM THE DATE OF THE 5 INCIDENT THAT LED TO THE INVESTIGATION.

6 SECTION 2. AND BE IT FURTHER ENACTED, That this Act shall take effect 7 October 1, 2023.
