- FOR the purpose of requiring each unit of State government to give preference to include

 materials when <u>purchasing establishing procurement specifications for</u> compost,
 mulch, or other soil amendments <u>or aggregate; requiring the Maryland Green</u>
 <u>Purchasing Committee to establish certain specifications and publish and maintain</u>
