1 (c) On or before [October 1] **DECEMBER 15**, 2023, the Authority shall report its 2 comprehensive neighborhood revitalization strategy, **INCLUDING ANY PROCUREMENT** 3 **ACTIVITIES UNDERTAKEN BY THE AUTHORITY**, to the Governor and, in accordance with 4 § 2–1257 of the State Government Article, to the Senate Budget and Taxation Committee, 5 **THE HOUSE HEALTH AND GOVERNMENT OPERATIONS COMMITTEE**, and the House 6 Appropriations Committee.

H Section 1 of this Act shall remain effective until the taking effect of the 30 termination provision specified in Section 2 of Chapters 80 and 81 of the Acts of the General 3132Assembly of 2021. If that termination provision takes effect, Section 1 of this Act, with no 33 further action required by the General Assembly, shall be abrogated and of no further force 34and effect. This Act may not be interpreted to have any effect on that termination provision. Section 2 of this Act shall remain effective through September 30, 2026, and, at the end of 35

- 2 Assembly, shall be abrogated and of no further force and effect.
