- 1 (g) (3) An award provided under subsection [(d)(2)(v)] (D)(2)(IV) of this section may not exceed the amount specified in subsection (e)(2) of this section when 3 combined with any other scholarship received by a student based on the student's status 4 as a child or spouse of a victim of the September 11, 2001, terrorist attacks.
- SECTION 2. AND BE IT FURTHER ENACTED, This Act may not be construed to have any effect on any scholarship awarded under the Edward T. Conroy Memorial Scholarship Program to the surviving spouse of a member of the armed forces who suffered a service connected 100% permanent disability on or before December 7, 1941.
- 9 SECTION 3. AND BE IT FURTHER ENACTED, That this Act shall take effect July 10 1, 2023.
