1 AN ACT concerning

Higher Education – Edward T. Conroy Memorial Scholarship Program – Surviving Spouses of Service Members

FOR the purpose of specifying that a certain surviving spouse of a member of the armed
forces is eligible to apply for a scholarship under the Edward T. Conroy Memorial
Scholarship Program if the service member died, suffered a service connected
disability, or was declared to be a prisoner of war or missing in action under certain
circumstances; and generally relating to the Edward T. Conroy Memorial
Scholarship Program.

- 20 SECTION 1. BE IT ENACTED BY THE GENERAL ASSEMBLY OF MARYLAND,
- 21 That the Laws of Maryland read as follows:

7 (g) (3) An award provided under subsection [(d)(2)(v)] (D)(2)(IV) of this 8 section may not exceed the amount specified in subsection (e)(2) of this section when 9 combined with any other scholarship received by a student based on the student's status 10 as a child or spouse of a victim of the September 11, 2001, terrorist attacks.

11 SECTION 2. AND BE IT FURTHER ENACTED, This Act may not be construed to 12 have any effect on any scholarship awarded under the Edward T. Conroy Memorial 13 Scholarship Program to the surviving spouse of a member of the armed forces who suffered 14 a service connected 100% permanent disability on or before December 7, 1941.

15 SECTION 3. AND BE IT FURTHER ENACTED, That this Act shall take effect July16 1, 2023.
