Court, a circuit court, the Court of Special Appeals, or the Court of Appeals;

(iii) a judge of a United States District Court, a United States Court
 of Appeals, or the United States Tax Court; or

7 (iii) any deputy clerk designated by the [county administrative 8 judge] CLERK of the circuit court for the county; or

9 (iv) a judge.
