FOR the purpose of establishing the 21st Century Financial Systems Council to modernize $\mathbf{5}$ 6 the financial management information systems infrastructure in the State; specifying the responsibilities and priorities of the Council: establishing the position 7 of the 21st Century Financial Systems Director in the Office of the Comptroller; and 8 9 generally relating to the 21st Century Financial Systems Council requiring the 10 Office of the Comptroller, the Office of the State Treasurer, the Department of 11 Budget and Management, the Department of Information Technology, and the Department of General Services, in consultation with a representative of the 12 Modernize Maryland Oversight Commission, to develop, implement, manage, and 13oversee the 21st Century Financial Systems Enterprise; and generally relating to 14 the modernization of State financial systems and the 21st Century Financial 15Systems Enterprise. 16

5 (IV) (8) OVERSEE AND BE RESPONSIBLE FOR THE OVERSIGHT,
6 IMPLEMENTATION, AND MANAGEMENT OF THE <u>21ST CENTURY FINANCIAL SYSTEMS</u>
7 ENTERPRISE.

8 (D) THE OFFICE OF THE COMPTROLLER, IN ACCORDANCE WITH § 2–1257 9 OF THIS ARTICLE, SHALL REPORT TO THE GENERAL ASSEMBLY ON THE STATUS OF 10 THE DEVELOPMENT OF THE 21ST CENTURY FINANCIAL SYSTEMS ENTERPRISE 11 BEGINNING ON OR BEFORE DECEMBER 31, 2023, AND EVERY 6 MONTHS 12 THEREAFTER, ENDING WITH THE FINAL REPORT DUE ON OR BEFORE JANUARY 1, 13 2027.

14 SECTION 2. AND BE IT FURTHER ENACTED, That this Act shall take effect 15 October July 1, 2023.
