5 (1) BEGINNING IN FISCAL YEAR 2020 AND ENDING IN FISCAL YEAR 6 2024, \$10,000,000; AND

7 (2) BEGINNING IN FISCAL YEAR 2025 AND EACH FISCAL YEAR 8 THEREAFTER, \$20,000,000.
