14	SECTION 1. BE IT ENACTED BY THE GENERAL ASSEMBLY OF MARYLAND,
15	That the Laws of Maryland read as follows:

18	(a) The Commission consists of:
19	(1) three commissioners from Prince George's County, appointed by the
20	County Executive subject to the confirmation of the County Council; and

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$\frac{1}{2}$	(b) (1) Each commissioner from Prince George's County shall be a resident of the sanitary district.
$\frac{3}{4}$	(2) (i) Each commissioner from Montgomery County shall be a registered voter of Montgomery County.
$5 \\ 6$	(ii) Each commissioner from Prince George's County shall be a registered voter of Prince George's County.
7 8	(3) AT LEAST ONE COMMISSIONER FROM EACH COUNTY SHALL HAVE AT LEAST ONE OF THE FOLLOWING QUALIFICATIONS:
9 10 11	(I) 1. A MASTER'S DEGREE, A DOCTORAL DEGREE, OR AN EQUIVALENT LEVEL OF EDUCATION DETERMINED IN ACCORDANCE WITH THE 2011 INTERNATIONAL STANDARD CLASSIFICATION OF EDUCATION; AND
12 13 14	2. AT LEAST 5 YEARS' EXPERIENCE IN THE MANAGEMENT OF A GOVERNMENTAL ENTITY OR BOARD OF DIRECTORS THAT IS COMPARABLE TO THE COMMISSION IN SCOPE AND COMPLEXITY;
15	(II) EDUCATION IN THE ENVIRONMENTAL SCIENCES; OR
16	(III) PROFESSIONAL EXPERIENCE IN UTILITY MANAGEMENT.
17 18 19	(c) (1) An individual may not be appointed or continue in office as a commissioner if the individual holds any other position of profit or trust under the Constitution or laws of the State or any political subdivision of the State.

$\begin{array}{c} 22\\ 23 \end{array}$	(d) (1) The term of a commissioner is 4 years and begins on June 1 of the year of appointment.
$\begin{array}{c} 24 \\ 25 \end{array}$	(2) The terms of commissioners are staggered as required by the terms provided for commissioners on July 1, 1982.
$\begin{array}{c} 26 \\ 27 \end{array}$	(3) At the end of a term, a commissioner continues to serve until a successor is appointed and takes the oath of office.
$\begin{array}{c} 28\\ 29 \end{array}$	(4) A commissioner who is appointed after a term has begun serves only for the rest of the term and until a successor is appointed and takes the oath of office.
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1 (E) THE GENERAL MANAGER OF THE COMMISSION HAS THE SAME VOTING 2 POWERS AS THE COMMISSIONERS ON ALL MATTERS BEFORE THE COMMISSION 3 EXCEPT REGARDING DECISIONS RELATING TO:

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(1) THE INSPECTOR GENERAL OR THE SECRETARY; OR

5 (2) THE SALARY OF THE GENERAL MANAGER, THE INSPECTOR 6 GENERAL, OR THE SECRETARY.

7 SECTION 2. AND BE IT FURTHER ENACTED, That this Act shall take effect 8 October 1, 2023.
