18 SECTION 1. BE IT ENACTED BY THE GENERAL ASSEMBLY OF MARYLAND,
19 That the Laws of Maryland read as follows:

14 (A) (1) FOR THE LIMITED PURPOSE OF FURTHERING AN ONGOING
 15 CRIMINAL INVESTIGATION UNDER THIS SUBTITLE, THE ATTORNEY GENERAL OR A
 16 DEPUTY ATTORNEY GENERAL OR AN ASSISTANT ATTORNEY GENERAL DESIGNATED
 17 IN WRITING BY THE ATTORNEY GENERAL MAY ISSUE IN ANY COURT IN THE STATE A
 18 SUBPOENA TO A PERSON TO PRODUCE TELEPHONE, BUSINESS, GOVERNMENT, OR
 19 CORPORATE RECORDS OR DOCUMENTS.

20 (2) A SUBPOENA ISSUED UNDER THIS SUBSECTION MAY BE SERVED IN
 21 THE SAME MANNER AS A SUBPOENA ISSUED BY A CIRCUIT COURT.

22 (B) (1) A PERSON MAY HAVE AN ATTORNEY PRESENT DURING ANY
 23 CONTACT MADE UNDER SUBSECTION (A) OF THIS SECTION WITH THE ATTORNEY
 24 GENERAL OR AN AGENT OF THE ATTORNEY GENERAL.

25 (2) THE ATTORNEY GENERAL SHALL ADVISE A PERSON OF THE
 26 RIGHT TO COUNSEL WHEN THE SUBPOENA IS SERVED.

27 (C) (1) (i) IF A PERSON FAILS TO OBEY A LAWFULLY SERVED
 28 SUBPOENA UNDER SUBSECTION (A) OF THIS SECTION, THE ATTORNEY GENERAL
 29 MAY REPORT THE FAILURE TO OBEY THE SUBPOENA TO THE CIRCUIT COURT WITH
 30 JURISDICTION OVER THE MATTER.

31 (ii) THE ATTORNEY GENERAL SHALL PROVIDE A COPY OF THE
 32 SUBPOENA AND PROOF OF SERVICE TO THE CIRCUIT COURT.

33 (2) AFTER CONDUCTING A HEARING AT WHICH THE PERSON THAT
 34 ALLEGEDLY FAILED TO COMPLY WITH A SUBPOENA ISSUED UNDER SUBSECTION (A)

1 OF THIS SECTION HAS HAD AN OPPORTUNITY TO BE HEARD AND BE REPRESENTED
2 BY COUNSEL, THE COURT MAY GRANT APPROPRIATE RELIEF.

3 (D) THIS SECTION DOES NOT ALLOW THE CONTRAVENTION, DENIAL, OR
4 ABROGATION OF A PRIVILEGE OR RIGHT RECOGNIZED BY LAW.

5 SECTION 2. AND BE IT FURTHER ENACTED, That this Act shall take effect
6 October 1, 2023.
