- FOR the purpose of establishing the Commission on History, Culture, and Civics in Education to make recommendations to the State Board of Education and the State Department of Education to further the discovery, interpretation, and learning of the history, culture, and civics of the United States and Maryland; and generally relating to the Commission on History, Culture, and Civics in Education.

- 13 SECTION 1. BE IT ENACTED BY THE GENERAL ASSEMBLY OF MARYLAND,
- 14 That the Laws of Maryland read as follows:

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- 17 (A) (1) THERE IS A COMMISSION ON HISTORY, CULTURE, AND CIVICS IN
- 18 **EDUCATION.**
- 19 (2) THE PURPOSE OF THE COMMISSION IS TO MAKE
- 20 RECOMMENDATIONS TO THE STATE BOARD AND THE DEPARTMENT TO FURTHER
- 21 THE DISCOVERY, INTERPRETATION, AND LEARNING OF THE HISTORY, CULTURE,

(C) (1) TO THE EXTENT PRACTICABLE, THE MEMBERSHIP OF THE

- 2 DIVERSITY OF THE STATE.
- 3 (2) A MAJORITY OF THE MEMBERS OF THE COMMISSION SHALL HAVE
- 4 CLASSROOM EXPERIENCE OR EXPERIENCE IN DEVELOPING EDUCATION CONTENT
- 5 STANDARDS.
- 6 (D) (1) THE TERM OF A MEMBER IS 4 YEARS.
- 7 (2) THE TERMS OF MEMBERS ARE STAGGERED AS REQUIRED BY THE 8 TERMS PROVIDED FOR MEMBERS OF THE COMMISSION ON JULY 1, 2023.
- 9 **(E)** THE COMMISSION MEMBERS SHALL ELECT A CHAIR FROM AMONG THE 10 MEMBERS.
- 11 (F) THE DEPARTMENT SHALL PROVIDE STAFF FOR THE COMMISSION.
- 12 (G) A MEMBER OF THE COMMISSION:
- 13 (1) MAY NOT RECEIVE COMPENSATION AS A MEMBER OF THE
- 14 COMMISSION; BUT
- 15 (2) IS ENTITLED TO REIMBURSEMENT FOR EXPENSES UNDER THE
- 16 STANDARD STATE TRAVEL REGULATIONS, AS PROVIDED IN THE STATE BUDGET.
- 17 (H) THE COMMISSION SHALL:
- 18 (1) EXAMINE THE HISTORY, CULTURE, AND CIVICS OF THE UNITED
- 19 STATES AND MARYLAND, INCLUDING:
- 20 (I) THE CONTRIBUTIONS OF AMERICAN INDIANS, LATINOS,
- 21 AFRICAN AMERICANS, AND ASIAN AMERICANS;
- 22 (II) THE CONTRIBUTIONS OF LESBIAN, GAY, BISEXUAL,
- 23 TRANSGENDER, AND QUEER INDIVIDUALS WITHIN THE MINORITY GROUPS;
- 24 (III) THE INTERSECTIONALITY OF SIGNIFICANT SOCIAL AND
- 25 CULTURAL FEATURES WITHIN THE MINORITY COMMUNITIES;
- 26 (IV) THE CONTRIBUTIONS AND PERSECUTION OF RELIGIOUS
- 27 MINORITIES;

- SECTION 3. AND BE IT FURTHER ENACTED, That this Act shall take effect July 3 $\,$ 1, 2023.
