#### 1 AN ACT concerning

## Election Law - Voting Systems - Sourced, Manufactured, and Assembled in the United States

# FOR the purpose of prohibiting the State Board of Elections from certifying a voting system unless the State Board determines that the voting system is sourced, manufactured,

- 12 SECTION 1. BE IT ENACTED BY THE GENERAL ASSEMBLY OF MARYLAND, 13 That the Laws of Maryland read as follows:
- 14 Article Election Law
- 15 9–102.
- 16 (d) The State Board may not certify a voting system unless the State Board 17 determines that:
- 18 (1) the voting system will:
- 19 (i) protect the secrecy of the ballot;
- 20 (ii) protect the security of the voting process;
- 21 (iii) count and record all votes accurately;

accommodate any ballot used under this article; 1 (iv)  $\mathbf{2}$ (v) protect all other rights of voters and candidates; 3 (vi) be capable of creating a paper record of all votes cast in order that an audit trail is available in the event of a recount, including a manual recount; and 4  $\mathbf{5}$ provide a voter-verifiable paper record that: (vii) 6 1. is an individual document that is physically separated from any other similar document and not part of a continuous roll; 7 8 2.is sufficiently durable to withstand repeated handling for 9 the purposes of mandatory random audits and recounts; and 10 3. uses ink that does not fade, smear, or otherwise degrade 11 and obscure or obliterate the paper record over time; 12(2)the voting system has been: 13(i) examined by an independent testing laboratory that is approved by the U.S. Election Assistance Commission; and 1415shown by the testing laboratory to meet the performance and test (ii) standards for electronic voting systems established by the Federal Election Commission or 1617the U.S. Election Assistance Commission; [and] 18 (3) THE VOTING SYSTEM, INCLUDING ALL PARTS AND COMPONENTS 19OF THE VOTING SYSTEM, IS: 20**(I)** SOURCED ENTIRELY FROM THE UNITED STATES; AND 21**(II)** MANUFACTURED AND ASSEMBLED BY LABOR PERFORMED 22ENTIRELY IN THE UNITED STATES; AND 23**[**(3)**] (4)** the public interest will be served by the certification of the voting 24system. SECTION 2. AND BE IT FURTHER ENACTED, That this Act shall take effect 2526January 1, 2028.

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
