or death for hypertension to be presumed to be an occupational disease that was
suffered in the line of duty and is compensable under workers' compensation law;

covered employee under § 9–234 of this title is presumed to have an occupational disease
 that was suffered in the line of duty and is compensable under this title if:

3 [(1)] (I) 1. the individual has heart disease[, hypertension,] or lung 4 disease;

5 [(2)] 2. the heart disease [, hypertension,] or lung disease results 6 in partial or total disability or death; and

7 [(3)] **3.** in the case of a volunteer firefighter, volunteer fire 8 fighting instructor, volunteer rescue squad member, or volunteer advanced life support unit 9 member, the individual has met a suitable standard of physical examination before 10 becoming a firefighter, fire fighting instructor, rescue squad member, or advanced life 11 support unit member; **OR**

(II) 1. THE INDIVIDUAL HAS HYPERTENSION; AND
