Higher Education – Appointment of Secretary and Student Financial Assistance – Alterations <u>Accommodations at Public Institutions for</u> <u>Religious Beliefs</u>
FOR the purpose of providing that the Secretary of Higher Education is appointed by, and serves at the pleasure of, the Governor; requiring each institution of higher education to adopt a certain written policy regarding the provision of reasonable academic accommodations for students to practice sincerely held faith—based or religious beliefs; altering eligibility criteria for, and the process for awards from, the Delegate Howard P. Rawlings Program of Educational Excellence Awards; altering eligibility criteria for services provided to students through the Next Generation Scholars of Maryland Program; altering the administration of the Maryland Community College Promise Scholarship in place of the Office of Student Financial assistance within the Maryland Higher Education


