## A BILL ENTITLED

AN ACT concerning

## Vehicle Laws - Lanes of Travel - Slower Traffic and Overtaking and Passing (MOVE GET OUT THE WAY Act)

FOR the purpose of expanding to every roadway in the State a requirement that a driver of a vehicle traveling slower than the general speed of traffic drive the vehicle in the right-hand lanes under certain circumstances; providing that, on a roadway that has three or more lanes for traffic moving in the same direction with a certain posted maximum speed limit, the far left lane may be used only for overtaking and passing another vehicle in a certain manner and under certain circumstances; and generally relating to driving in the right-hand lanes of roadways and the overtaking and passing of vehicles in the left-hand lane.

SECTION 1. BE IT ENACTED BY THE GENERAL ASSEMBLY OF MARYLAND, That the Laws of Maryland read as follows:

## Article - Transportation

21-301.
(b) (1) On every roadway, except while overtaking and passing another vehicle going in the same direction or when preparing for a lawful left turn, any vehicle going 10 miles per hour or more below the applicable maximum speed limit or, if any existing conditions reasonably require a speed below that of the applicable maximum, at less than
the normal speed of traffic under these conditions, shall be driven in the right-hand lane then available for traffic or as close as practicable to the right-hand curb or edge of the roadway.
(2) (i) [1. In this paragraph the following words have the meanings
indicated.
of this article.
2. "Interstate highway" has the meaning stated in § 8-101(j)
3. "Rural area" means an area outside the fixed boundaries of an urban area as defined under $\S 8-507$ of this article.
(ii) 1.] On [an interstate highway located in a rural area] EVERY ROADWAY, a driver of a vehicle traveling slower than the general speed of traffic, if practicable as determined by the driver, shall drive in the right-hand lane or lanes.
[2. A. This paragraph establishes the policy of the State and guidance with respect to the rules of the road.
B. A person may not be issued a citation for a violation of this paragraph.
(iii)] (II) The Administration shall include the requirement under subparagraph [(ii)] (I) of this paragraph in the State's driver education curriculum.
[(iv)] (III) The State Highway Administration shall inform drivers of the requirement under subparagraph [(ii)] (I) of this paragraph:

1. By placing and maintaining signs at regular intervals on appropriate highways; and
2. Through the dynamic message sign system located throughout the State.

21-303.
(a) Except as otherwise provided in this subtitle, this section governs the overtaking and passing of vehicles going in the same direction.
(b) The driver of a vehicle overtaking another vehicle that is going in the same direction shall pass to the left of the overtaken vehicle at a safe distance.
(c) The driver of a vehicle overtaking another vehicle that is going in the same direction, until safely clear of the overtaken vehicle, may not drive any part of [his] THE DRIVER'S vehicle directly in front of the overtaken vehicle.
(d) (1) Except when overtaking and passing on the right is permitted, the driver of an overtaken vehicle, on audible signal, shall give way to the right in favor of the overtaking vehicle.
(2) (I) NOTWITHSTANDING PARAGRAPH (1) OF THIS SUBSECTION, ON A ROADWAY THAT HAS THREE OR MORE LANES FOR TRAFFIC MOVING IN THE SAME DIRECTION AND WITH A POSTED MAXIMUM SPEED LIMIT OF 55 MILES PER HOUR OR MORE, A DRIVER MAY USE THE FAR LEFT LANE ONLY FOR OVERTAKING and passing another vehicle and, after overtaking and passing the OTHER VEHICLE, SHALL RETURN TO THE RIGHT LANE AS SOON AS IT IS REASONABLY SAFE TO DO SO.

## (II) SUBPARAGRAPH (I) OF THIS PARAGRAPH DOES NOT APPLY

 TO:1. A VEHICLE IN THE FAR LEFT LANE PREPARING FOR A LEFT TURN OR LEFT EXIT;
2. A VEHICLE IN A HIGH OCCUPANCY VEHICLE LANE IF:
A. THE HIGH OCCUPANCY VEHICLE LANE IS A SINGLE LANE MOVING IN ONE DIRECTION; AND
B. The high occupancy vehicle restrictions are IN EFFECT; OR
3. TRAFFIC CONDITIONS THAT REQUIRE THE USE OF ALL ROADWAY LANES.
(e) Except when overtaking and passing on the right is permitted, the driver of an overtaken vehicle, until completely passed by the overtaking vehicle, may not increase the speed of [his] THE DRIVER'S vehicle.
(F) A PERSON WHO IS CONVICTED OF A VIOLATION OF SUBSECTION (D)(2)(I) OF THIS SECTION IS SUBJECT TO:
(1) FOR A FIRST OFFENSE, A FINE OF \$75;
(2) FOR A SECOND OFFENSE, A FINE OF \$150; AND
(3) FOR A THIRD OR SUBSEQUENT OFFENSE, A FINE OF $\$ 250$.

SECTION 2. AND BE IT FURTHER ENACTED, That this Act shall take effect October 1, 2023.
