A BILL ENTITLED

1 AN ACT concerning

2 **Maryland–National Capital Park and Planning Commission – Members**

3 **MC/PG 109–23**

4 FOR the purpose of repealing the requirement that not more than three members of the
5 Maryland–National Capital Park and Planning Commission from each county be
6 members of the same political party; requiring the County Council of Montgomery
7 County and the County Executive of Prince George's County to consider certain
8 diversity needs when making appointments for membership on the Commission;
9 establishing that the party composition of county commissioners from each county
10 shall be based on the election results for the County Executive in the last preceding
11 general election; and generally relating to the membership of the
12 Maryland–National Capital Park and Planning Commission.

23 SECTION 1. BE IT ENACTED BY THE GENERAL ASSEMBLY OF MARYLAND,
24 That the Laws of Maryland read as follows:

2 (a) There is a Maryland–National Capital Park and Planning Commission.

3 (b) The Commission is a body politic and corporate and is an agency of the State.

4 15–102.

5 (a) (1) The Commission consists of 10 members.

6 (2) Of the 10 members of the Commission:

7 (i) five shall be residents and registered voters of Montgomery
8 County; and

9 (ii) five shall be residents and registered voters of Prince George’s
10 County.

11 (3) (i) Subject to the approval of the County Executive, the County
12 Council shall appoint each commissioner from Montgomery County.

13 (ii) Subject to the approval of the County Council, the County
14 Executive shall appoint each commissioner from Prince George’s County.

15 (b) Each commissioner shall be an individual of ability, experience, and integrity.

16 (c) (1) [Of the commissioners from each county, not more than three shall be
17 members of the same political party] **WHEN MAKING AN APPOINTMENT FOR
18 MEMBERSHIP ON THE COMMISSION, THE COUNTY COUNCIL OF MONTGOMERY
19 COUNTY AND, SUBJECT TO § 15–103(B) OF THIS SUBTITLE, THE COUNTY EXECUTIVE
20 OF PRINCE GEORGE’S COUNTY SHALL CONSIDER THE NEED FOR GEOGRAPHIC,
21 POLITICAL, RACIAL, ETHNIC, AND GENDER DIVERSITY AND FOR THE INCLUSION OF
22 INDIVIDUALS WITH DISABILITIES ON THE COMMISSION.**

23 **(2) OF THE COMMISSIONERS FROM EACH COUNTY:**

24 **(I) IF THE COUNTY EXECUTIVE RECEIVED LESS THAN 80% OF
25 THE VOTES CAST AT THE LAST PRECEDING GENERAL ELECTION, NOT MORE THAN
26 THREE COMMISSIONERS MAY BE OF THE SAME POLITICAL PARTY AS THE COUNTY
27 EXECUTIVE; OR**

28 **(II) IF THE COUNTY EXECUTIVE RECEIVED AT LEAST 80% OF
29 THE VOTES CAST AT THE LAST PRECEDING GENERAL ELECTION, NOT MORE THAN
30 FOUR COMMISSIONERS MAY BE OF THE SAME POLITICAL PARTY AS THE COUNTY
31 EXECUTIVE.**

1 ~~[(2)]~~ **(3)** A commissioner may not be selected as representing or
2 supporting any special interest.

3 (d) (1) The term of a commissioner is 4 years and begins on June 15.

4 (2) The terms of commissioners are staggered as required by the terms
5 provided for commissioners on October 1, 2012.

6 (3) At the end of a term, a commissioner continues to serve until a successor
7 is appointed and qualifies.

8 (4) A commissioner who is appointed after a term has begun serves only for
9 the rest of the term and until a successor is appointed and qualifies.

10 (5) A commissioner who is appointed to fill a vacancy for an unexpired term
11 shall be a member of the same political party as the commissioner who vacated the office.

12 (6) (i) Except as provided in subparagraph (ii) of this paragraph, a
13 commissioner appointed from Montgomery County may not be appointed for three
14 consecutive full terms.

15 (ii) A commissioner appointed from Montgomery County may be
16 appointed for a maximum of three consecutive full terms as a member of the Commission
17 if the commissioner is designated as chair of the Montgomery County Planning Board
18 during the commissioner's second term in office.

19 SECTION 2. AND BE IT FURTHER ENACTED, That this Act shall take effect
20 October 1, 2023.
