## Cremations – Natural Organic Reduction – Regulation

- 3 FOR the purpose of regulating cremations that reduce human remains to soil through natural organic reduction; specifying that the State Board of Morticians and Funeral 4 Directors has exclusive authority to license and regulate a crematory that only 5 performs cremations that reduce human remains to soil through natural organic 6 7 reduction authorizing the Director of the Office of Cemetery Oversight and the State 8 Board of Morticians and Funeral Directors to adopt regulations establishing a 9 process for regulating crematories that utilize natural organic reduction; and generally relating to cremation and natural organic reduction. 10
