2 Health Insurance – Reimbursement for Services Rendered by a Pharmacist

FOR the purpose of requiring the Maryland Medical Assistance Program, the Maryland
Children's Health Program, and certain insurers, nonprofit health service plans, and
health maintenance organizations to provide coverage for all services rendered by a
licensed pharmacist within the pharmacist's lawful scope of practice, rather than
only certain services, to the same extent as services rendered by any other health
care practitioner; and generally relating to reimbursement for health care services
provided by a pharmacist.

17 (b) An entity subject to this section shall provide coverage for services rendered 18 by a licensed pharmacist [under § 12–509 of the Health Occupations Article] ACTING 19 WITHIN THE PHARMACIST'S LAWFUL SCOPE OF PRACTICE to an individual who is 20 covered under a policy or contract issued or delivered by the entity, to the same extent as 21 services rendered by any other licensed health care practitioner[, for patient assessment 22 regarding and in administering self-administered medications, maintenance injectable 23 medications, or injectable medications for treatment of sexually transmitted infections].

24(C)**REIMBURSEMENT FOR SERVICES PROVIDED UNDER THIS SECTION MAY**25NOT BE CONDITIONED ON WHETHER THE LICENSED PHARMACIST IS:

AND BE IT FURTHER ENACTED, That, to implement § 15–151 of the 29 Health – General Article, as enacted by Section 1 of this Act, on or before January 1, 2024, 30 the Maryland Department of Health shall apply for and obtain from the U.S. Department 31 of Health and Human Services any necessary amendments to or waivers for the Maryland 32 Medical Assistance Program or the Maryland Children's Health Program.
