## 15 (A) IN THIS SECTION, "COMPENSATION" INCLUDES STIPENDS FOR 16 TRANSPORTATION, TRAINING, AND BONUS PAYMENTS.

## 17 [(a)] (B) (1) A local board may fix the compensation of election judges within 18 the limits authorized for this purpose by the county's governing body.
