2 **Maryland Medical Assistance Program and Health Insurance – Required**
3 **Coverage for Biomarker Testing**

4 FOR the purpose of requiring the Maryland Medical Assistance Program and certain
5 insurers, nonprofit health service plans, health maintenance organizations, and
6 managed care organizations to provide coverage for biomarker testing that is
7 supported by medical and scientific evidence; establishing requirements for
8 deductibles, copayments, coinsurance, and utilization review for biomarker testing;
9 and generally relating to the coverage of biomarker testing by the Maryland Medical
10 Assistance Program and health insurance carriers.

11 SECTION 1. BE IT ENACTED BY THE GENERAL ASSEMBLY OF MARYLAND,
 12 That the Laws of Maryland read as follows:

19 (a) (1) The Secretary shall administer the Maryland Medical Assistance
 20 Program.

21 (2) The Program:

22 (xx) Beginning on July 1, 2023, shall provide, subject to federal
 23 approval and limitations of the State budget, community violence prevention services in
 24 accordance with § 15–141.3 of this subtitle; [and]

25 (xxi) Beginning on January 1, 2023, shall provide, subject to the
 26 limitations of the State budget, and as permitted by federal law, coverage for self–measured
 27 blood pressure monitoring for all Program recipients diagnosed with uncontrolled high
 28 blood pressure, including:

29 1. The provision of validated home blood pressure monitors;
 30 and

31 2. Reimbursement of health care provider and other staff
 32 time used for patient training, transmission of blood pressure data, interpretation of blood
 33 pressure readings and reporting, and the delivery of co–interventions, including

1 educational materials or classes, behavioral change management, and medication

9 (A) (1) IN THIS SECTION THE FOLLOWING WORDS HAVE THE MEANINGS
10 INDICATED.

11 (2) (I) "BIOMARKER" MEANS A CHARACTERISTIC THAT IS
12 OBJECTIVELY MEASURED AND EVALUATED AS AN INDICATOR OF NORMAL
13 BIOLOGICAL PROCESSES, PATHOGENIC PROCESSES, OR PHARMACOLOGIC
14 RESPONSES TO A SPECIFIC THERAPEUTIC INTERVENTION, INCLUDING KNOWN
15 GENE-DRUG INTERACTIONS FOR MEDICATIONS BEING CONSIDERED FOR USE OR
16 ALREADY BEING ADMINISTERED.

17 (II) "BIOMARKER" INCLUDES GENE MUTATIONS,
18 CHARACTERISTICS OF GENES, OR PROTEIN EXPRESSION.

19 (3) (I) "BIOMARKER TESTING" IS THE ANALYSIS OF A PATIENT'S
20 TISSUE, BLOOD, OR OTHER BIOSPECIMEN FOR THE PRESENCE OF A BIOMARKER,
21 THE RESULTS OF WHICH:

22 1. PROVIDE INFORMATION THAT MAY BE USED IN THE
23 FORMULATION OF A TREATMENT OR MONITORING STRATEGY THAT INFORMS A
24 PATIENT'S OUTCOME AND IMPACTS THE CLINICAL DECISION; AND

25 2. INCLUDE BOTH INFORMATION THAT IS ACTIONABLE
26 AND SOME INFORMATION THAT CANNOT BE IMMEDIATELY USED IN THE
27 FORMULATION OF A CLINICAL DECISION.

28 (II) "BIOMARKER TESTING" INCLUDES SINGLE-ANALYTE
29 TESTS, MULTI-PLEX PANEL TESTS, PROTEIN EXPRESSION, AND WHOLE EXOME,
30 WHOLE GENOME, AND WHOLE TRANSCRIPTOME SEQUENCING.

31 (B) THIS SECTION APPLIES TO:

1 (1) INSURERS AND NONPROFIT HEALTH SERVICE PLANS THAT
2 PROVIDE HOSPITAL, MEDICAL, OR SURGICAL BENEFITS TO INDIVIDUALS OR GROUPS
3 ON AN EXPENSE-INCURRED BASIS UNDER HEALTH INSURANCE POLICIES OR
4 CONTRACTS THAT ARE ISSUED OR DELIVERED IN THE STATE; AND

5 (2) HEALTH MAINTENANCE ORGANIZATIONS THAT PROVIDE
6 HOSPITAL, MEDICAL, OR SURGICAL BENEFITS TO INDIVIDUALS OR GROUPS UNDER
7 CONTRACTS THAT ARE ISSUED OR DELIVERED IN THE STATE.

8 (C) AN ENTITY SUBJECT TO THIS SECTION SHALL PROVIDE COVERAGE FOR
9 BIOMARKER TESTING FOR THE PURPOSE OF DIAGNOSIS, TREATMENT, APPROPRIATE
10 MANAGEMENT, OR ONGOING MONITORING OF A DISEASE OR CONDITION THAT IS
11 SUPPORTED BY MEDICAL AND SCIENTIFIC EVIDENCE, INCLUDING TESTING:

12 (1) CLEARED OR APPROVED BY THE U.S. FOOD AND DRUG
13 ADMINISTRATION;

14 (2) REQUIRED OR RECOMMENDED FOR A DRUG APPROVED BY THE
15 U.S. FOOD AND DRUG ADMINISTRATION TO ENSURE AN INSURED OR ENROLLEE IS
16 A GOOD CANDIDATE FOR THE DRUG TREATMENT;

17 (3) REQUIRED OR RECOMMENDED THROUGH A WARNING OR
18 PRECAUTION FOR A DRUG APPROVED BY THE U.S. FOOD AND DRUG
19 ADMINISTRATION TO IDENTIFY WHETHER AN INSURED OR ENROLLEE WILL HAVE AN
20 ADVERSE REACTION TO THE DRUG TREATMENT OR DOSAGE;

21 (4) COVERED UNDER A CENTERS FOR MEDICARE AND MEDICAID
22 SERVICES NATIONAL COVERAGE DETERMINATION OR MEDICARE
23 ADMINISTRATIVE CONTRACTOR LOCAL COVERAGE DETERMINATION; OR

24 (5) SUPPORTED BY NATIONALLY RECOGNIZED CLINICAL PRACTICE
25 GUIDELINES THAT ARE:

26 (I) DEVELOPED BY INDEPENDENT ORGANIZATIONS OR
27 MEDICAL PROFESSIONAL SOCIETIES USING A TRANSPARENT METHODOLOGY AND
28 REPORTING STRUCTURE AND THAT HAVE A CONFLICT OF INTEREST POLICY; AND

29 (II) ESTABLISHED STANDARDS OF CARE INFORMED BY A
30 SYSTEMATIC REVIEW OF EVIDENCE AND AN ASSESSMENT OF THE BENEFITS AND
31 RISKS OF ALTERNATIVE CARE OPTIONS AND INCLUDE RECOMMENDATIONS
32 INTENDED TO OPTIMIZE PATIENT CARE; ~~OR~~

33 ~~(6) SUPPORTED BY CONSENSUS STATEMENTS THAT ARE:~~

~~(I) DEVELOPED BY AN INDEPENDENT, MULTIDISCIPLINARY PANEL OF EXPERTS USING A TRANSPARENT METHODOLOGY AND REPORTING STRUCTURE AND THAT HAVE A CONFLICT OF INTEREST POLICY; AND~~

~~(II) AIMED AT SPECIFIC CLINICAL CIRCUMSTANCES AND BASE THE STATEMENTS ON THE BEST AVAILABLE EVIDENCE FOR THE PURPOSE OF OPTIMIZING THE OUTCOMES OF CLINICAL CARE.~~

(D) AN ENTITY SUBJECT TO THIS SECTION SHALL ENSURE THAT THE COVERAGE REQUIRED UNDER SUBSECTION (C) OF THIS SECTION IS PROVIDED IN A MANNER THAT LIMITS DISRUPTIONS IN CARE INCLUDING THE NEED FOR MULTIPLE BIOPSIES OR BIOSPECIMEN SAMPLES.

(E) (1) SUBJECT TO PARAGRAPH (2) OF THIS SUBSECTION, THE COVERAGE REQUIRED UNDER THIS SECTION MAY BE SUBJECT TO THE ANNUAL DEDUCTIBLES, COPAYMENTS, OR COINSURANCE REQUIREMENTS IMPOSED BY AN ENTITY SUBJECT TO THIS SECTION FOR SIMILAR COVERAGES UNDER THE SAME HEALTH INSURANCE POLICY OR CONTRACT.

(2) THE ANNUAL DEDUCTIBLES, COPAYMENTS, OR COINSURANCE REQUIREMENTS IMPOSED UNDER PARAGRAPH (1) OF THIS SUBSECTION FOR THE COVERAGE REQUIRED UNDER THIS SECTION MAY NOT BE GREATER THAN THE ANNUAL DEDUCTIBLES, COPAYMENTS, OR COINSURANCE REQUIREMENTS IMPOSED BY THE ENTITY FOR SIMILAR COVERAGES.

~~(F) (1) AN ENTITY SUBJECT TO THIS SECTION THAT REQUIRES PRIOR AUTHORIZATION OR A SIMILAR UTILIZATION REVIEW PROCEDURE FOR THE COVERAGE REQUIRED UNDER SUBSECTION (C) OF THIS SECTION SHALL MAKE A DETERMINATION REGARDING A REQUEST FOR APPROVAL WHEN SUBMITTED ELECTRONICALLY:~~

~~(I) IN REAL TIME IF THE BIOMARKER TESTING IS TO GUIDE THE PROVISION OF PHARMACEUTICAL SERVICES THAT ARE URGENT AND NO ADDITIONAL INFORMATION IS NEEDED TO PROCESS THE REQUEST; AND~~

~~(II) FOR OTHER REQUESTS, IN ACCORDANCE WITH § 19-108.2 OF THE HEALTH GENERAL ARTICLE.~~

~~(2) IF A RESPONSE TO A PRIOR AUTHORIZATION OR SIMILAR UTILIZATION REVIEW REQUEST FOR APPROVAL IS NOT RECEIVED IN THE TIME FRAMES REQUIRED UNDER THIS SUBSECTION, THE REQUEST SHALL BE CONSIDERED APPROVED.~~

1 SECTION 2. AND BE IT FURTHER ENACTED, That on or before December 1,
 2 2024, the Maryland Department of Health shall report to the Governor and, in accordance
 3 with § 2–1257 of the State Government Article, the General Assembly on the following:

4 (1) the fiscal impact of the biomarkers testing coverage required under
 5 Section 1 of this Act on the Maryland Medical Assistance Program’s policy on biomarkers
 6 testing coverage for specific cancers during fiscal year 2024;

7 (2) any available data on use of biomarkers testing by race and ethnicity in
 8 the Program;

9 (3) the anticipated fiscal and access impacts of expanding the coverage
 10 required under Section 1 of this Act to the Maryland Medical Assistance Program in fiscal
 11 year 2026; and

12 (4) recommendations on any legislative changes to the requirements
 13 established under Section 1 of this Act relating to the Maryland Medical Assistance
 14 Program, including managed care organizations.

15 SECTION 3. AND BE IT FURTHER ENACTED, That on or before December 1,
 16 2025, the Maryland Health Care Commission shall report to the Senate Finance Committee
 17 and the House Health and Government Operations Committee, in accordance with §
 18 2–1257 of the State Government Article, on the impact of providing biomarker testing
 19 coverage required under Section 1 of this Act, including an analysis of the impact of
 20 providing access to biomarker testing to individuals based on race, gender, age, and public
 21 or private insurance.

 23 apply to all policies, contracts, and health benefit plans issued, delivered, or renewed in the
 24 State on or after January 1, 2024.

 26 January 1, 2024.
