A BILL ENTITLED

1 AN ACT concerning

2 Election Law – Polling Places at Continuing Care Retirement Communities

FOR the purpose of requiring local boards of elections to establish separate precincts at certain continuing care retirement communities if requested; requiring the continuing care retirement communities to provide to the local boards facilities that meet certain requirements to be used as polling places and assistance in recruiting election judges from among the residents of the communities; and generally relating to the establishment of precincts and polling places at continuing care retirement communities.
