1 AN ACT concerning

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2 Equity in Transportation Sector – Guidelines and Analyses

FOR the purpose of requiring that equity be considered when certain State transportation plans, reports, and goals are developed; altering the membership of the advisory committee on State transportation goals, benchmarks, and indicators; requiring the Department of Transportation, in collaboration with the Maryland Transit Administration, to conduct certain analyses and consult with certain communities before announcing or proposing certain service changes; requiring the Administration to take certain actions to avoid or minimize certain disparate impacts or disproportionate burdens; requiring the Administration to compile a report on the impacts of a proposed service change after holding a public hearing on the proposed service change; requiring the Department, in collaboration with the Administration, to conduct certain analyses and consult with certain communities before announcing any reduction or cancellation of a capital expansion project in the construction program of the Consolidated Transportation Program; requiring the
