# 2 Supplemental Nutrition Assistance Programs – Waiver – Diapers and Menstrual 3 Hygiene Products

- 4 FOR the purpose of requiring the Department of Human Services to apply for a waiver to allow benefits under the Supplemental Nutrition Assistance Program or the Special  $\mathbf{5}$ 6 Supplemental Nutrition Assistance Program to be used to purchase diapers or 7 menstrual hygiene products, if the U.S. Department of Agriculture makes the waiver 8 available; requiring the Maryland Department of Health to apply for a waiver to 9 allow benefits under the Special Supplemental Program for Women, Infants, and Children to be used to purchase diapers or menstrual hygiene products, if the U.S. 10 Department of Agriculture makes the waiver available; and generally relating to the 11 Supplemental Nutrition Assistance Program and the Special Supplemental 12 Nutrition Assistance Program for Women, Infants, and Children. 13

1 (A) IF THE U.S. DEPARTMENT OF AGRICULTURE MAKES AVAILABLE TO THE 2 STATE A WAIVER ALLOWING RECIPIENTS OF SUPPLEMENTAL NUTRITION 3 ASSISTANCE PROGRAM OR <u>SPECIAL SUPPLEMENTAL NUTRITION ASSISTANCE</u> 4 PROGRAM BENEFITS TO USE BENEFITS TO PURCHASE DIAPERS OR MENSTRUAL 5 HYGIENE PRODUCTS, THE DEPARTMENT SHALL APPLY FOR THE WAIVER.
