- 6 (a) Except as provided in [§ 4–701.1] §§ 4–701.1 AND 4–701.2 of this subtitle, 7 this section applies to any person who is required under this subtitle or Subtitle 2, 8, 9, or
- 8 10 of this title to be licensed to guide fishing parties or to catch, sell, buy, process, transport,
- 9 export, or otherwise deal in fish caught in tidal waters.
- 10 (b) (1) Except as provided in [§ 4-701.1] §§ 4-701.1 AND 4-701.2 of this
- 11 subtitle, the Department shall utilize a single, commercial license, to be known and
- 12 designated as a tidal fish license.
- 13 (d) (2) (ii) The following annual fees for an authorization shall apply
- 14 regardless of when the license is issued or an activity is authorized:
- 4. For a person to buy, process, pack, resell, market or
- otherwise deal in fish caught in the tidal waters of Maryland, seafood dealer:
- A. \$50 for a person licensed under item 2 of this

- B. \$250 for a person not licensed under item 2 of this

- 29 (2) A LICENSEE SHALL FISH IN ACCORDANCE WITH DEPARTMENT

1 2 3	(C) A PERSON WHO WISHES TO OBTAIN THE LICENSE SHALL COMPLETE AND SUBMIT AN APPLICATION FOR THE LICENSE TO THE DEPARTMENT OR ANY PERSON DESIGNATED BY THE DEPARTMENT.
4 5	(D) AN APPLICANT FOR THE LICENSE DOES NOT NEED TO HOLD A TIDAL FISH LICENSE UNDER § 4–701 OF THIS SUBTITLE TO BE ELIGIBLE FOR THE LICENSE.
6 7	(E) THE TERM OF THE LICENSE IS 1 YEAR FROM SEPTEMBER 1 THROUGH AUGUST 31 THE FOLLOWING YEAR.
8	(F) THE ANNUAL LICENSE FEE IS \$15.
9 10	(G) A LICENSEE MAY NOT TRANSFER A LICENSE ISSUED UNDER THIS SECTION.
11 12 13	(H) A LICENSEE SHALL HAVE A COMMERCIAL BLUE AND FLATHEAD CATFISH FINFISH TROTLINE LICENSE IN THE LICENSEE'S POSSESSION WHEN THE LICENSEE FISHES UNDER THE LICENSE.
14 15 16 17 18	SECTION 2. AND BE IT FURTHER ENACTED, That this Act is an emergency measure, is necessary for the immediate preservation of the public health or safety, has been passed by a yea and nay vote supported by three—fifths of all the members elected to each of the two Houses of the General Assembly, and shall take effect from the date it is enacted.
