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Maryland Longitudinal Data System Center – Student FAFSA Data – Reporting Requirement

- FOR the purpose of altering a certain reporting requirement to require the Maryland Longitudinal Data System Center to report certain student Free Application for Federal Student Aid (FAFSA) data to certain committees of the General Assembly by a certain date in certain years; requiring the Maryland Higher Education Commission to provide the Center with access to student FAFSA data; and generally relating to the Maryland Longitudinal Data System Center and reporting of student FAFSA data.
