# Victim Services Programs – Supplementing Federal Funding and Support (Victim Services Stabilization Act)

FOR the purpose of providing for the funding of certain victim services programs; requiring
the Governor's Office of Crime Prevention, Youth, and Victim Services to help
support certain programs providing services for victims of crime; requiring the Office
to consult with certain individuals and organizations regarding the allocation of
certain funding; requiring the Governor to include certain funding in the State
budget; and generally relating to victim services programs.
