1 AN ACT concerning

2 **Prince George's County – Prince George's County Reentry Employment**
3 **Incentive Program – Funding**

4 FOR the purpose of requiring the Governor, in certain fiscal years, to include in the annual
5 budget bill certain funding to the Prince George's County Office of the County
6 Executive to be used for the Prince George's County Reentry Employment Incentive
7 Program; and generally relating to reentry employment incentives in Prince George's
8 County.

10 Article – Local Government
11 Section 16–505
12 Annotated Code of Maryland
13 (2013 Volume and 2022 Supplement)

14 SECTION 1. BE IT ENACTED BY THE GENERAL ASSEMBLY OF MARYLAND,
15 That the Laws of Maryland read as follows:

16 **Article – Local Government**

17 **16–505.**

18 **(A) FOR EACH OF FISCAL YEARS 2025 THROUGH 2028, THE GOVERNOR**
19 **SHALL INCLUDE IN THE ANNUAL BUDGET BILL AN APPROPRIATION OF \$500,000 TO**
20 **THE PRINCE GEORGE'S COUNTY OFFICE OF THE COUNTY EXECUTIVE TO BE USED**

1 FOR THE PRINCE GEORGE’S COUNTY REENTRY EMPLOYMENT INCENTIVE
2 PROGRAM UNDER § 10-334 OF THE PRINCE GEORGE’S COUNTY CODE.

3 (B) THE FUNDS PROVIDED UNDER THIS SECTION SHALL BE SUPPLEMENTAL
4 TO, AND MAY NOT SUPPLANT, FUNDS OTHERWISE AVAILABLE FOR REENTRY
5 EMPLOYMENT INCENTIVES IN PRINCE GEORGE’S COUNTY.

6 SECTION 2. AND BE IT FURTHER ENACTED, That this Act shall take effect July
7 1, 2023. It shall remain effective for a period of 5 years and, at the end of June 30, 2028,
8 this Act, with no further action required by the General Assembly, shall be abrogated and
9 of no further force and effect.
