| AN ACT concerning |
| Municipalities - Charter Amendments - Notice |
| FOR the purpose of modifying the manner in which the chief executive officer of a municipality may fulfill certain notice requirements; requiring the municipality to maintain certain records or receipts and make the records or receipts available to the public; and generally relating to methods of providing notice of municipal charter amendment resolutions. |
| BY repealing and reenacting, with amendments, Article – Local Government Section 4–304(b) and 4–305(f) Annotated Code of Maryland (2013 Volume and 2022 Supplement) |

- 7 [(ii)] 2. on the day of the referendum, posting a similar copy at the 8 place for voting; and
- 9 **[**(2)**] (II) 1.** publishing notice of the referendum and a fair summary of the proposed amendment in a newspaper of general circulation in the municipality at least once in each of the 4 weeks immediately preceding the referendum; **OR**

- 27 (II) MAKE THE RECORD OR COPY AVAILABLE TO THE GENERAL 28 PUBLIC IN ACCORDANCE WITH THE MARYLAND PUBLIC INFORMATION ACT.
