| AN ACT concerning |
| Health Occupations - State Board of Chiropractic Examiners - Disciplinary Actions and Procedures |
| FOR the purpose of authorizing the State Board of Chiropractic Examiners to deny a license to an applicant or take certain action against a licensee for failure to follow an order |
| of the Board take disciplinary action against an applicant or a licensee for failing to |
| comply with a Board order; authorizing the Board to grant a stay of enforcement of |
| a Board order in accordance with the Administrative Procedure Act; prohibiting a |
| Board order an order of the Board from being stayed pending judicial review; |
| authorizing the Board to appeal a decision that reverses or modifies its order; |
| authorizing the Board to reinstate a suspended or revoked license only under certain circumstances; and generally relating to chiropractors in accordance with the terms |
| and conditions of the order of suspension or revocation or an order of reinstatement |
| issued by the Board; and generally relating to disciplinary actions by the State Board |
| of Chiropractic Examiners. |
