CHAPTER _____

1 AN ACT concerning

2 Massage Therapy – Definition, <u>Registration</u>, and Reimbursement

- FOR the purpose of altering the definition of "massage therapy"; altering the date after 3 which the option to be registered by the State Board of Massage Therapy Examiners 4 $\mathbf{5}$ to practice massage therapy in a setting that is not a health care setting will no 6 longer be available; repealing a provision of law that provides that certain provisions 7 of law do not require a nonprofit health insurance plan, an insurer, a health 8 maintenance organization, or a person acting as a third party administrator to reimburse a licensed massage therapist or registered massage practitioner for any 9 10 services rendered; and generally relating to the regulation of massage therapists and 11 massage practitioners.

16	(f) (3) "Massage therapy" does not include:
17	(i) The diagnosis [or treatment] of illness, disease, or injury;

31	(2) On or after November 1, 2026, licensed by the Board.

21	<u>4.</u> <u>Professional ethics;</u>
22	<u>5.</u> <u>Health and hygiene;</u>
23	<u>6.</u> <u>Research;</u>
24	7. <u>Supervised hands-on techniques; and</u>
25	8. <u>Clinical assessment and documentation;</u>
26	(4) <u>Has passed an examination approved by the Board; and</u>

3 (e) On or after October 1, [2023] **2024**, the Board may not issue an initial 4 registration to practice as a registered massage practitioner.

6 This subtitle does not require a nonprofit health service plan, an insurer, a health 7 maintenance organization, or a person acting as a third party administrator to reimburse 8 a licensed massage therapist or registered massage practitioner for any services rendered 9 even though the services are within the scope of practice of the licensed massage therapist 10 or registered massage practitioner.]

AND BE IT FURTHER ENACTED, That an individual registered by</u> 13 <u>the State Board of Massage Therapy Examiners on October 1, [2023]</u> 2024, shall be 14 <u>considered, in all respects, registered as a registered massage practitioner by the Board</u> 15 <u>and, subject to the provisions of this Act, for the remainder of the term of the individual's</u> 16 registration.

17 <u>SECTION 3. AND BE IT FURTHER ENACTED, That the State Board of Massage</u> 18 <u>Therapy Examiners shall adopt regulations necessary to implement the provisions of</u> 19 Section 1 of this Act on or before October 1, [2023] **2024**.

AND BE IT FURTHER ENACTED, That an individual registered by</u> <u>the State Board of Massage Therapy Examiners on October 1, [2023] 2024, shall be</u> <u>considered, in all respects, registered as a registered massage practitioner by the Board</u> <u>and, subject to the provisions of this Act, for the remainder of the term of the individual's</u> <u>registration.</u>

<u>SECTION 3. AND BE IT FURTHER ENACTED, That the State Board of Massage</u>
<u>Therapy Examiners shall adopt regulations necessary to implement the provisions of</u>
<u>Section 1 of this Act on or before October 1, [2023] 2024.</u>

SECTION 2. AND BE IT FURTHER ENACTED, That this Act shall take effect July
1, 2023.

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
