SECTION 1. BE IT ENACTED BY THE GENERAL ASSEMBLY OF MARYLAND,

(b) “Area agency” means the local agency that the Department designates in accordance with the Older Americans Act of 1965 to administer the delivery of a comprehensive and coordinated plan of social and other services and activities for seniors in a planning and service area.

5 **(A) FOR FISCAL YEAR 2025 AND EACH FISCAL YEAR THEREAFTER, THE**
6 **GOVERNOR SHALL INCLUDE IN THE ANNUAL BUDGET BILL AN APPROPRIATION OF**
7 **\$2,400,000 TO MANAGE THE LONG-TERM CARE AND DEMENTIA CARE NAVIGATION**
8 **PROGRAMS STATEWIDE AND TO FUND THE PROGRAMS LOCALLY.**

9 **(B) THE FUNDS APPROPRIATED UNDER THIS SECTION SHALL BE**
10 **DISTRIBUTED PROPORTIONALLY TO EACH AREA AGENCY BASED ON A FORMULA**
11 **DETERMINED BY THE DEPARTMENT THAT CONSIDERS THE NEEDS AND SIZE OF**
12 **EACH JURISDICTION.**

14 1, 2023.
