FOR the purpose of providing that a person charged with reckless or negligent driving that contributes to an accident that results in the death of another person must appear in court and may not prepay the fine; altering the penalty for reckless driving; and generally relating to reckless and negligent driving.

(D) A person convicted of a violation of subsection (a) of this section is subject to
 <u>IMPRISONMENT NOT EXCEEDING 5 DAYS OR</u> a fine not exceeding \$1,000 <u>OR BOTH</u>.
