- 11 SECTION 1. BE IT ENACTED BY THE GENERAL ASSEMBLY OF MARYLAND,
- 12 That the Laws of Maryland read as follows:

- 14 SUBTITLE 17. MISCELLANEOUS PROVISIONS.
- 15 **6–1701.**
- 16 (A) IN THIS SECTION, "ORIENTED STRAND BOARD" MEANS A
- 17 MULTILAYERED BOARD THAT IS:
- 18 (1) MADE FROM STRANDS OF WOOD, TOGETHER WITH A BINDER, BY
- 19 THE APPLICATION OF HEAT AND PRESSURE, WITH THE STRANDS IN THE EXTERNAL
- 20 LAYER PRIMARILY ORIENTED ALONG THE STRENGTH AXIS OF THE PANEL IN
- 21 ACCORDANCE WITH THE U.S. DEPARTMENT OF COMMERCE VOLUNTARY PRODUCT
- 22 STANDARD PS 2-18, PERFORMANCE STANDARD FOR WOOD STRUCTURAL PANELS;
- 23 AND

- 1 (2) INTENDED TO BE USED AS A COVERING MATERIAL FOR ROOFS, 2 SUBFLOORS, AND WALLS WHEN FASTENED TO SUPPORTS.
- 3 (B) THIS SECTION DOES NOT APPLY TO THE MANUFACTURE, SALE, USE, OR
 4 DISTRIBUTION OF PRODUCTS OR MATERIALS THAT CONTAIN ORIENTED STRAND
 5 BOARD FOR PURPOSES OUTSIDE OF FIRE-FIGHTING TRAINING PURPOSES.
- 6 (C) A PERSON MAY NOT SET ON FIRE OR BURN ORIENTED STRAND BOARD FOR FIRE-FIGHTING TRAINING PURPOSES.
- 8 (D) A PERSON WHO VIOLATES THIS SECTION IS SUBJECT TO:
- 9 (1) FOR A FIRST VIOLATION, A CIVIL PENALTY NOT EXCEEDING \$500; 10 AND
- 11 (2) FOR A SECOND OR SUBSEQUENT VIOLATION, A CIVIL PENALTY 12 NOT EXCEEDING \$1,000.
- SECTION 2. AND BE IT FURTHER ENACTED, That this Act shall take effect October 1, 2023.
