### 3 SECTION 2. AND BE IT FURTHER ENACTED, That:

- 4 On or before <del>December 1, 2023</del> October 1, 2024, the Maryland Health Care (a) 5 Commission, in coordination with the Behavioral Health Administration, the Maryland 6 Higher Education Commission, the Maryland Department of Labor, the Career and 7 Technical Education Committee, and other interested stakeholders, shall conduct a comprehensive behavioral health workforce needs assessment. 8
- 9 (b) The assessment shall:
- 10 determine the immediate, intermediate, and long-term unmet need 11 and capacity of the behavioral health workforce in the State, including demographics and 12 gaps in specific professionals and paraprofessionals, accounting for retirements and other 13 turnover:
- 14 (2)calculate the total number of additional behavioral health professionals 15 and paraprofessionals needed over the next 5 years, 10 years, and 20 years;
- 16 make findings and recommendations regarding the types of training, (3)17 education, and tuition assistance programs necessary to certify, recruit, place, supervise, and retain the additional behavioral health professionals and paraprofessionals identified 18 in item (2) of this subsection; and 19
- 20 recommend an initial allocation to the Behavioral Health Workforce 21 Investment Fund established under § 10–1602 of the Health – General Article, as enacted 22by Section 1 of this Act, and identify specifically which programs the allocation will support 23 and the number of professionals and paraprofessionals the allocation will train, certify, 24recruit, and place.
- 25 On or before <del>December 15, 2023</del> October 15, 2024, the Maryland Health Care 26 Commission shall submit the assessment to the Senate Budget and Taxation Committee, 27 the Senate Finance Committee, the House Appropriations Committee, and the House 28 Health and Government Operations Committee, in accordance with § 2–1257 of the State 29 Government Article.
- 30 SECTION 3. AND BE IT FURTHER ENACTED, That this Act shall take effect July 1, 2023. 31
