1 2	(ii) For [an eligible] A veteran OR AN ELIGIBLE SPOUSE, the Department shall pay for the grave liner.
$\frac{3}{4}$	(iii) For an eligible [spouse or]-dependent, the grave liner shall be paid for by the family or estate.
$5 \\ 6$	(i) (1) The Department shall bury the veteran OR ELIGIBLE SPOUSE <u>OR</u> <u>DEPENDENT</u> without charge.
7 8	(2) For burial of a member of the immediate family who is an eligible [spouse or]-dependent, the Department may set a fee that does not exceed the cost of burial.
9 10	SECTION 2. AND BE IT FURTHER ENACTED, That this Act shall take effect October 1, 2023.
