### 1 AN ACT concerning

# Department of Veterans Affairs – Burial in State Veterans' Cemeteries – Spouses <u>and Dependents</u>

- FOR the purpose of requiring the Department of Veterans Affairs to bury the eligible
  spouse <u>or dependent</u> of a veteran in a State veterans' cemetery without charge; and
  generally relating to the burial of veterans' spouses or dependents.
