AN ACT concerning
Baltimore City – West North Avenue Development Authority – Membership and Procurement
FOR the purpose of altering the membership of the West North Avenue Development Authority; <u>altering the date a certain comprehensive report is due and altering the content of the report;</u> exempting the Authority from certain provisions of State procurement law; and generally relating to the West North Avenue Development Authority.
BY repealing and reenacting, without amendments, Article – Economic Development Section 12–702 Annotated Code of Maryland (2018 Replacement Volume and 2022 Supplement)

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SECTION 2. 3. AND BE IT FURTHER ENACTED, That this Act is an emergency measure, is necessary for the immediate preservation of the public health or safety, has 3 been passed by a yea and nay vote supported by three-fifths of all the members elected to 4 each of the two Houses of the General Assembly, and shall take effect from the date it is enacted. \(\frac{1}{2}\) \(\frac{Section 1 of this Act}{2}\) shall remain effective until the taking effect of the 6 termination provision specified in Section 2 of Chapters 80 and 81 of the Acts of the General Assembly of 2021. If that termination provision takes effect, Section 1 of this Act, with no 8 further action required by the General Assembly, shall be abrogated and of no further force 9 and effect. This Act may not be interpreted to have any effect on that termination provision. 10 Section 2 of this Act shall remain effective through September 30, 2026, and, at the end of September 30, 2026, Section 2 of this Act, with no further action required by the General Assembly, shall be abrogated and of no further force and effect. 12
