10 SECTION 1. BE IT ENACTED BY THE GENERAL ASSEMBLY OF MARYLAND,
11 That the Laws of Maryland read as follows:

12 **Article – Courts and Judicial Proceedings**

14 (a) In each county in the first seven judicial circuits there shall be the number of
15 resident judges of the circuit court set forth below, including the judge or judges provided
16 for by the Constitution:

17	(1) Allegany.....	2

20	(4) Calvert.....	3
