1 AN ACT concerning

State Board of Examiners of Psychologists – License and Registration Issuance and Renewals – Electronic Means

- FOR the purpose of requiring the State Board of Examiners of Psychologists to issue
 electronic licenses and certificates; repealing the requirement that the Board include
 certain information on each license and registration; altering the circumstances
 under which the Board is required to send renewal notices by first-class mail; and

- SECTION 1. BE IT ENACTED BY THE GENERAL ASSEMBLY OF MARYLAND,
