# Provision of Veterinary Services - Routine Medical Care Practice of Veterinary <u>Medicine</u> and Rabies Vaccines

FOR the purpose of authorizing the State Board of Veterinary Medical Examiners to issue 4  $\mathbf{5}$ a license to an animal control facility to administer rabies vaccines; requiring the 6 State Board of Veterinary Medical Examiners to establish a certain process to 7 authorize a certain veterinary practitioner licensed to practice veterinary medicine in another state or jurisdiction to provide routine medical care become licensed to 8 9 practice veterinary medicine in the State <del>under certain circumstances</del>; requiring the 10 Secretary of Health to allow individuals who work in or for a certain veterinary 11 hospital or a certain animal control facility certain individuals to administer rabies 12 vaccines under certain circumstances; and generally relating to the provision of 13veterinary services in the State.

1 (1) the status of establishing an expedited process for a veterinary 2 practitioner who holds a valid, current license to practice veterinary medicine in another 3 state or jurisdiction to become licensed to practice veterinary medicine in the State as 4 authorized under Section 1 of this Act; and

5 (2) any financial support needed to implement the expedited process.
