1 (ii) If the enrollee has 25 or more years of service as an employee of 2 the State in the Executive, Legislative, or Judicial Branch of government, the enrollee or 3 the enrollee's surviving spouse or dependent child is entitled to the same State subsidy 4 allowed a retiree with 25 or more years of creditable service under § 2–508(c)(4)(i) of this 5 subtitle.

6 SECTION 3. <u>2.</u> AND BE IT FURTHER ENACTED, That this Act shall take effect 7 June 1, 2023.
