CHAPTER
AN ACT concerning
Natural Resources - Restorative Aquaculture Pilot Program
FOR the purpose of requiring the Department of Natural Resources to establish and implement a Restorative Aquaculture Pilot Program to provide financial incentives to certain holders of aquaculture leases; authorizing a holder of an aquaculture lease who is participating in the Pilot Program to meet certain requirements by shellfish seed planting only; <i>providing for the financing of the financial incentives under the Pilot Program;</i> and generally relating to the Restorative Aquaculture Pilot Program.
BY adding to Article – Natural Resources Section 4–11A–24 Annotated Code of Maryland (2018 Replacement Volume and 2022 Supplement)
