CHAPTER _____

1 AN ACT concerning

2 **Economic Development – Sports Entertainment Facilities – Financing and**
3 **Construction**

4 FOR the purpose of altering the amount of taxable or tax exempt bonds that the Maryland
5 Stadium Authority may issue for certain sports entertainment facilities; altering the
6 entities from which the Authority is required to have received a request for financing
7 and construction management services concerning a sports entertainment facility;
8 altering the entities with which the Authority is required to enter into an agreement
9 before issuing bonds to finance a sports entertainment facility; and generally
10 relating to sports entertainment facilities.

21 SECTION 1. BE IT ENACTED BY THE GENERAL ASSEMBLY OF MARYLAND,
22 That the Laws of Maryland read as follows:

3 (c) (1) Unless authorized by the General Assembly, the Board of Public Works
4 may not approve an issuance by the Authority of bonds, whether taxable or tax exempt,
5 that constitute tax supported debt or nontax supported debt if, after issuance, there would
6 be outstanding and unpaid more than the following face amounts of the bonds for the
7 purpose of financing acquisition, construction, renovation, and related expenses for
8 construction management, professional fees, and contingencies in connection with:

9 (i) the Baltimore Convention facility – \$55,000,000;

10 (ii) the Hippodrome Performing Arts facility – \$20,250,000;

11 (iii) the Montgomery County Conference facility – \$23,185,000;

12 (iv) the Ocean City Convention facility – \$24,500,000;

13 (v) Baltimore City public school facilities – \$1,100,000,000;

14 (vi) supplemental facilities – \$25,000,000;

15 (vii) racing facilities – \$375,000,000;

16 (viii) public school facilities in the State – \$2,200,000,000;

17 (ix) the Hagerstown Multi–Use Sports and Events Facility –
18 \$59,500,000;

19 (x) sports entertainment facilities – [~~\$200,000,000~~] **\$220,000,000**;

20 and

21 (xi) Prince George’s County Blue Line Corridor facilities –
22 \$400,000,000.

24 (a) Except as authorized by § 10–639 of this subtitle, to finance site acquisition,
25 design, construction, equipping, and furnishing of any segment of a sports entertainment
26 facility, the Authority shall comply with this section.

27 (b) (1) The Authority shall have received a written request for financing and
28 construction management services from the State, a county, or a local government in which
29 the sports entertainment facility is located or to be located **OR A NONPROFIT**

1 **ORGANIZATION THAT WILL OWN OR OPERATE THE SPORTS ENTERTAINMENT**
2 **FACILITY.**

3 (2) The request shall include:

4 (i) the location of the proposed sports entertainment facility;

5 (ii) the amount, source, and timing of funding not including
6 Authority bonds which may be issued to finance the proposed sports entertainment facility;
7 and

8 (iii) a description of the anticipated use of the proposed sports
9 entertainment facility.

10 (e) The Authority may not issue bonds to finance a sports entertainment facility
11 until the Authority secures a written agreement with the State, county, or local government
12 in which the sports entertainment facility is located **OR A NONPROFIT ORGANIZATION**
13 **THAT WILL OWN OR OPERATE THE SPORTS ENTERTAINMENT FACILITY**, as approved
14 by the Board of Public Works, under which:

15 (1) the source of funding and the order in which funds will be spent is
16 described; and

17 (2) the State, county, [or] local government, **OR NONPROFIT**
18 **ORGANIZATION** agrees to:

19 (i) own, market, promote, and operate or contract for the marketing,
20 promotion, and operation of the sports entertainment facility in a manner that maximizes
21 the facility's economic return;

22 (ii) maintain and repair or contract for the maintenance and repair
23 of the sports entertainment facility so as to keep the sports entertainment facility in
24 first-class operating condition; and

25 (iii) any other terms or conditions deemed necessary or appropriate
26 by the Authority.

27 (f) On or before December 31 each year, a county or local government in which a
28 sports entertainment facility financed in whole or in part under this subtitle is located **OR**
29 **A NONPROFIT ORGANIZATION THAT OWNS OR OPERATES A SPORTS ENTERTAINMENT**
30 **FACILITY** shall report to the Senate Budget and Taxation Committee and the House
31 Appropriations Committee, in accordance with § 2-1257 of the State Government Article,
32 on the sports entertainment facility's assessment of the maintenance and repair needed to
33 keep the facility in operating order.

1 SECTION 2. AND BE IT FURTHER ENACTED, That this Act shall take effect July
2 1, 2023.
