1 AN ACT concerning

2 **Alcoholic Beverages – Manufacturer’s Licenses and Off-Site Permits**

3 FOR the purpose of extending the termination date for certain provisions of law relating to  
4 the authorization of holders of certain manufacturer’s licenses to sell and deliver and  
5 to directly ship their own alcoholic beverages products to certain individuals under  
6 certain circumstances; establishing the maximum amount of beer and liquor that  
7 holders of certain manufacturer’s licenses may directly ship to consumers in a  
8 calendar year; delaying a certain effective date for the authorization of certain  
9 manufacturer off-site permits; and generally relating to alcoholic beverages,  
10 manufacturer’s licenses, and off-site permits.

22 SECTION 1. BE IT ENACTED BY THE GENERAL ASSEMBLY OF MARYLAND,  
 23 That the Laws of Maryland read as follows:

26 SECTION 4. AND BE IT FURTHER ENACTED, That this Act is an emergency  
 27 measure, is necessary for the immediate preservation of the public health or safety, has

7 (c) (1) During an event listed in subsection (e) of this section, the permit holder  
8 may:

9 (i) provide samples and sell products to a consumer that are  
10 manufactured by the permit holder under the permit holder's license;

11 (ii) provide to a consumer a sample that may not exceed:

12 1. 1 fluid ounce for each offering of wine;

13 2. 1 fluid ounce for each offering of beer; or

14 3. 0.25 fluid ounce for each offering of liquor;

15 (iii) sell to a consumer for on–premises consumption; and

16 (iv) subject to paragraph (2) of this subsection, sell to a consumer for  
17 off–premises consumption.

18 (2) The holder of a Class 5 brewery license, a Class 7  
19 micro–brewery license, or a Class 8 farm brewery license may sell to each consumer at an  
20 approved off–site permitted event under the permit up to 288 ounces of beer for  
21 off–premises consumption.

23 (a) This section does not apply to the holder of a:

24 (1) Class 2 rectifying license;

25 (2) Class 3 winery license; or

26 (3) Class 6 pub–brewery license.

27 (b) [A] SUBJECT TO SUBSECTION (D) OF THIS SECTION, A holder of a  
28 manufacturer's license may sell and deliver a product produced under the holder's license  
29 to an individual located in the State if:

8 and delivered a product produced under the holder’s license to an individual located in the  
9 State in accordance with § 2-219 of the Alcoholic Beverages Article, as enacted by Section 1  
10 of this Act, shall submit a report to the Alcohol and Tobacco Commission specifying the  
11 amount of liquor or beer shipped and delivered to individuals in the State in accordance  
12 with this section.

13 SECTION ~~2.~~ 3. AND BE IT FURTHER ENACTED, That this Act shall take effect  
14 July 1, 2023.
