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## A BILL ENTITLED

1 AN ACT concerning

2 **Public Safety – Permit to Wear, Carry, or Transport a Handgun Denial – Refund**  
3 **of Application Fee**

4 FOR the purpose of requiring the Secretary of State Police to refund certain application  
5 fees under certain circumstances to individuals who were previously denied a permit  
6 to wear, carry, or transport a firearm within a certain timeframe; and generally  
7 relating to permits to wear, carry, or transport a handgun.

18 SECTION 1. BE IT ENACTED BY THE GENERAL ASSEMBLY OF MARYLAND,

19 That the Laws of Maryland read as follows:

20 **Article – Public Safety**

21 5–301.

22 (a) In this subtitle the following words have the meanings indicated.

23 (c) “Permit” means a permit issued by the Secretary to carry, wear, or transport  
24 a handgun.

2 (a) An application for a permit shall be made under oath.

3 (b) (1) Subject to subsections (c) [and], (d), AND (E) of this section, the  
4 Secretary may charge a nonrefundable fee payable when an application is filed for a permit.

5 (2) The fee may not exceed:

6 (i) \$75 for an initial application;

7 (ii) \$50 for a renewal or subsequent application; and

8 (iii) \$10 for a duplicate or modified permit.

9 (3) The fees under this subsection are in addition to the fees authorized  
10 under § 5–305 of this subtitle.

11 (c) The Secretary may reduce the fee under subsection (b) of this section  
12 accordingly for a permit that is granted for one day only and at one place only.

13 (d) The Secretary may not charge a fee under subsection (b) of this section to:

14 (1) a State, county, or municipal public safety employee who is required to  
15 carry, wear, or transport a handgun as a condition of governmental employment; or

16 (2) a retired law enforcement officer of the State or a county or municipal  
17 corporation of the State.

18 **(E) THE SECRETARY SHALL REFUND THE APPLICATION FEE UNDER**  
19 **SUBSECTION (B) OF THIS SECTION TO AN APPLICANT WHO:**

20 **(1) BETWEEN JULY 5, 2019, AND JULY 5, 2022, BOTH INCLUSIVE, WAS**  
21 **DENIED A PERMIT OR RENEWAL OF A PERMIT FOR FAILING TO SATISFY THE GOOD**  
22 **AND SUBSTANTIAL REASON REQUIREMENT UNDER § 5–306(A)(6)(II) OF THIS**  
23 **SUBTITLE; AND**

24 **(2) FILES A CLAIM IN A FORM AND CONTAINING THE INFORMATION**  
25 **AND SUPPORTING DOCUMENTS REQUIRED BY THE SECRETARY.**

26 **[(e)] (F)** The applicant shall pay a fee under this section by an electronic check,  
27 a credit card, or a method of online payment approved by the Secretary.

1 (a) Subject to subsection (c) of this section, the Secretary shall issue a permit  
2 within a reasonable time to a person who the Secretary finds:

3 (6) based on an investigation:

4 (ii) has good and substantial reason to wear, carry, or transport a  
5 handgun, such as a finding that the permit is necessary as a reasonable precaution against  
6 apprehended danger.

7 SECTION 2. AND BE IT FURTHER ENACTED, That this Act shall take effect  
8 October 1, 2023.
