SECTION 1. BE IT ENACTED BY THE GENERAL ASSEMBLY OF MARYLAND, That the Laws of Maryland read as follows:

- 16 (a) A person may not knowingly violate § 5–602 of this subtitle with:

17 (1) a mixture that contains heroin and a detectable amount of fentanyl or 18 any analogue of fentanyl; or

19 (2) fentanyl or any analogue of fentanyl.

20 (b) A person who violates this section is guilty of a felony and, in addition to any 21 other penalty imposed for a violation of § 5–602 of this subtitle, on conviction is subject to 22 imprisonment not exceeding [10] **20** years.

1 (c) A sentence imposed under this section shall be consecutive to and not 2 concurrent with any other sentence imposed under any other provision of law.

3 SECTION 2. AND BE IT FURTHER ENACTED, That this Act shall take effect 4 October 1, 2023.
