SECTION 2. AND BE IT FURTHER ENACTED, That this Act shall take effect July 31 32 1, 2023. It shall remain effective for a period of 2 years and, at the end of June 30, 2025, this Act, with no further action required by the General Assembly, shall be abrogated and 33 of no further force and effect. 34

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
