designee; the Director of the State Department of Assessments and Taxation, or (5)the Director's designee: three representatives of the Maryland Association of Counties (6)representing rural, suburban, and urban counties, respectively, designated by the Maryland Association of Counties; one representative of the Maryland Municipal League, designated by (7)the Maryland Municipal League; and four representatives of the solar energy industry, appointed by the (8)Governor, including: at least one representative with a history of working with solar (i) panels installed on rooftops; at least one representative with a history of working with solar (ii) panels installed on the ground; and at least one representative with a history of working with (iii) community solar energy generation. The Director of the Maryland Energy Administration shall designate the chair (c)of the Task Force. The Maryland Energy Administration shall provide staff for the Task Force. (d) (e) A member of the Task Force: may not receive compensation as a member of the Task Force; but (1)is entitled to reimbursement for expenses under the Standard State (2)Travel Regulations, as provided in the State budget. The Task Force shall study and make recommendations regarding a tax (f) strategy that is more competitive than the State's current strategy to maximize the installation of rooftop solar panels, to facilitate and promote installation of grid-connected generation of renewable energy, and to meet the State's renewable energy goals. (g) On or before December 15, 2023, the Task Force shall report its findings and recommendations, in accordance with § 2-1257 of the State Government Article, to the General Assembly.
