- 21a violation of Title 3, Subtitle 3 of the Criminal Law Article against a (1)
- 22 victim who is a minor:
 - (2) a crime of violence as defined in § 5–101 of the Public Safety Article;



- 1 (3) a crime against a victim who is a person eligible for relief as defined in 2 4-501 of the Family Law Article; or
- 3 (4) a violation of § 3–802 of the Criminal Law Article.
- 4 (b) A person who violates subsection (a) of this section is guilty of a misdemeanor 5 and on conviction is subject to imprisonment not exceeding 90 days.
- 6 SECTION 2. AND BE IT FURTHER ENACTED, That this Act shall take effect 7 October 1, 2023.
