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Environment – Collection and Reporting of Drinking Water and Wastewater Data and Information – Requirements

4 FOR the purpose of requiring a water utility operating in the State to provide certain data 5 and information to the Department of the Environment and comply with certain 6 reporting requirements; requiring a certain local government to provide certain data 7 and information to a certain water utility; requiring the Department to develop a 8 certain protocol and form to provide and report certain drinking water and 9 wastewater data and information; requiring the Department to create, operate, and maintain a statewide Open Water Data Reporting Platform that includes certain 10 11 data and information for each water utility operating in the State; requiring the 12 Department, on or before a certain date, to provide on its website a webpage for the 13 public to comment on the Platform; requiring the Department to collect and 14 consolidate certain water data and information reported by water utilities operating in the State and make the data and information available on the Platform beginning 15 16 on or before a certain date; requiring the Department, on or before a certain date and 17 with a certain frequency, to perform a certain review of the Platform; and generally 18 relating to the collection and reporting of water data.
